This Eucharist was written to follow a telling of the Christmas story that used some of the "Godly Play" methodology with its open ended "I wonder questions". It refers to both the Christmas and Easter stories but could also be used with a creation or ecological theme.

I wonder where God is?
I wonder how big is big?
I wonder how small is small?

And we look into the unfocused eyes of a new born baby
Surrounded by pilgrims from the four corners of the world
And wonder at how tiny and vulnerable God is.

I wonder how God is?
I wonder what existed before the Big Bang?
I wonder if the universe will end or if it will go on for ever?

And we look at a man travelling around and living life to the full
Sharing stories and bread and the odd cup of wine
Re-interpreting traditions and dreaming of the future.

and are challenged to share God's life in bread and wine.

And as Jesus shared peace with his disciples

And those who will come after us
Along with people from all four corners of the world
And the whole of God's creation
To break bread and pour wine
Remembering the words Jesus spoke

"This is my body, this is my blood
Do this in memory of me".

We have shared bread and wine and peace with one another
We have shared in God's yes to life
Let us now share God's life with the world.

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
