Homeless Intercessions

These intercessions give thanks to God for our homes but explore some of the reasons why people may not have a home or that home is not a place of safety and security. We used this on Homelessness Sunday after inviting people to write their individual prayers onto post-it notes and to stick them on a large cardboard box.

These were also adapted to become Homecoming God for a service focusing on the theme of Home.
