Faith and Politics

The Bible doesn't ignore the political realm - some stories even suggest that God may be seen working through the state and through those of other nationalities and faiths. This prayer refers to Cyrus the Persian (Iranian) king who is described in Isaiah 45: 1 as God's anointed and to the story in Matthew's gospel (Matthew 22: 21) where Jesus is questioned about whether it was lawful to pay taxes to Caesar. Faith and politics are interwoven and messy - this is an attempt to recognise and celebrate that God sees things from a much bigger, international and ecological perspective.
